Techno-economic analysis of CO₂ mineralization process using aqueous NaOH

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CO₂ mineralization is one of the prospective CO₂ utilization methods, which intends to convert CO₂ to more stable and valuable form. An idea of conversion of CO₂ to sodium bicarbonate (NaHCO₃) using aqueous sodium hydroxide (NaOH) was suggested earlier by Skyonic Corporation. The overall process is composed of chlor–alkali process, CO₂ absorption process, and product recovery process (crystallization and drying). However, its economic feasibility hasn't been proved yet. In this study, the mineralization process is designed on reference to the Skyonic's process using AspenPlusTM. Additionally, techno–economic analysis is carried out in comparison with a conventional NaHCO₃ production process (Solvay process) to discuss the economic feasibility.
